



# Learning Disability Reference Group

We had this meeting because Norman Campbell (from NHS Leeds) and Scott Cunningham (from Inclusion North) wanted to talk to us about the Yorkshire and Humber Health Self Assessment Framework.



Scott introduced the Health Self Assessment Framework and told us what it means for people in Leeds.

He explained that it was about checking how good health services are for people with learning disabilities in Leeds and what needs to be done to make things better.

Norman reminded us about the Big Health Check event that was held last year and told us that Leeds had done quite well in some areas but that other things needed working on.

Norman wanted to ask us questions about 3 different targets. These targets were:



**Target:** People with a learning disability can use the same health services and get the same treatment as anyone else.

**Target:** People with a learning disability are safe in the National Health Service.

**Target:** We are making progress on the things that Valuing People says will help people's health.

In each of these targets we had a lot of different questions to answer and think about.

After we had talked about these in our groups we stopped and had some well deserved lunch!



After lunch, we fed back a bit about what each group had talked about and Scott collected other comments that people had come up with as we had worked, these were written down on post its as we thought of them.

Norman thanked the Reference Group for all their hard work and told them he would be writing up their comments. The Yorkshire and Humber Health Self Assessment will be talked about at the next Partnership Board meeting on 16<sup>th</sup> March.
